
#### **Recent trends**

Little variation (-0.8%) was recorded in the number of hotels and similar establishments in 2000. The bed-places remained stable also (-0.2%). This stability came after a rise of 2.6% recorded in 1999.

2000 data on total overnight stays of tourists in collective accommodation establishments recorded an increase of 2.6% indicating a continuation of the positive trend of the previous year. This result is mostly due to a rise of 6.2% of the nights spent in hotels and similar establishments that largely offset the stability of the demand (-0.6%) recorded in other kinds of collective accommodation establishments. Resident nights spent grew by 4.4% breaking the negative trend of the previous years. Foreign tourist demand continued to rise in 2000 but at a moderate rate of 1% compared to 3.6% in 1999.

The deficit of the travel item of the Balance of Payments (referring to the Belgo-Luxembourg Economic Union-BLEU) grew by 9.2% in 2000. Though the travel receipts grew more than the travel expenditures (19.4% compared to 16.3%), the volume of the expenditures explained the increasing deficit. Travel receipts accounted for 17.4% of the credits of the services item of the Balance of Payments. Employment in the hotels and restaurants sector amounted to 136,000 persons recording an increase of 7.1% in 2000 with respect of 1999. The tourism sector represented 3.3% of total employment in 2000.

## Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)





## Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation - 2000




In 2000, there were 2 more hotels and similar establishments than in 1999 confirming the stability of the previous years. Bed-places grew by 2.6% in 2000.

The total nights spent in collective accommodation establishments remained stable (-0.1%) in 2000. This performance is due to the stability of foreign as well as domestic demand in collective accommodation establishments (with respectively +0.4% and -0.5% rates). Meanwhile, it is worth to note that the nights spent in hotels and similar establishments grew by 5.1% while the demand recorded in other kinds of collective establishments receded by 2.9%.

The deficit of the travel item of the Balance of Payments remained stable (+0.1%) in 2000. Though the travel receipts rose more than the travel expenditures (+29% compared to +21.4%), the volume of the expenditures explained the stability of the deficit. Travel receipts represented 19.8% of the credits of the Services item of the Balance of Payments in 2000.

Employment in hotels and restaurants grew by 4.6% in 2000 after declining by 12.2% in 1999. The HORECA sector accounted for 2.5% of total employment in 2000.

# Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)








#### **Recent trends**

In 2000, as in 1999 the number of hotels and similar establishments diminished slightly (-0.4% and -0.6% respectively). With a growth rate of 1.8%, the bed-places kept rising in 2000 continuing the positive trend of 1999 (+1.0%).

Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation establishments continued to grow in 2000 at a higher rate of nearly 5% compared to 3.9% in 1999. The 2000 result is due to the rise of both domestic and inbound tourism. Resident nights grew by 4.2%, a rate higher than the 3.9% recorded in 1999. Foreign tourist demand rose at a significant rate of 10.1% coming after a rise of 3.8% recorded in 1999.

The deficit of the travel item of the Balance of Payments worsened by 4.6% in 2000. Though travel receipts grew more than travel expenditures (11.7% compared to 7%), the volume of the expenditures explained the increasing deficit. This volume made Germany the biggest outbound tourist market in the European Union with international travel expenditure representing almost three times the travel receipts in 2000. Nevertheless, travel receipts accounted for 20.3% of the credits of the services item of the Balance of Payments in 2000. In 2000, employment in the hotels and restaurants sector amounted to 1,210,000 persons, recording an increase of 4% with respect to 1999. The tourism sector represented 3.2% of total employment in 1999.

# Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)






The number of hotels and similar establishments kept growing in 2000 at a lesser rate of 2.1% compared to 2.8% in 1999. The bed-places were also up by 1.6% indicating a continuation of the upward trend of the previous years.

The total nights spent in collective accommodation establishment grew by 1.4% continuing the upward trend of the previous years. Since resident nights spent declined by 1%, the 2000 result was due to the rise of 2.1% of foreign tourist demand. The drop of resident overnight stays in 2000 interrupted the upward trend of the previous years.

The surplus of the travel item of the Balance of Payments kept rising in 2000 but at a lesser rate of 12.6% compared to 14.6% in 1999. Despite a lower growth rate of +21.3% for travel receipts compared to +31.7% for travel expenditures, the volume of receipts explained the rise of the surplus in 2000. Travel receipts accounted for 48% of the credits of the Services item of the Balance of Payments.

In 2000, employment in HORECA sector remained stable and involved 253,000 persons. The HORECA sector represented 6.4% of total employment in 2000.

## Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)








The number of hotels and similar establishments remained fairly stable (+0.4%) in 2000. The bed-places grew at a higher rate of 1.3%. In 2000, there were 58 more hotels and similar establishments than in 1999 offering altogether 16,676 more bed-places.

Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments declined by 1.4% in 2000. This drop is attributable to a decline of 3.4% of foreign tourist demand. The resident nights rose by 2.3% continuing the positive trend of the previous years.

Spain enjoys the largest tourism foreign trade surplus among EU countries. The surplus of the travel item in the Balance of Payments kept rising in 2000 but at a lesser rate of 9.5% compared to 14% in 1999. The fall in the growth rate in 2000 was due to a fairly strong increase in travel expenditures (15.2%) and a lesser growth rate (+10.4%) of travel receipts. Travel credits accounted for more than half (58.8%) of the receipts of the services item of the Balance of Payments.

Employment in hotels and restaurants grew by 8.3% in 2000. The tourism sector employed 926,000 persons in 2000 representing 6.4% of total employment.






In 2000, the number of hotels and similar establishments remained stable (-0.3%) with 67 establishments less than in 1999. The number of bed-places totalled over 1.5 million, increasing by 1.6%.

Total nights spent in collective accommodation establishments continued to grow in 2000 but at a lesser rate of 1.2% compared to 6.4% in 1999. 2000 result is due to the rise of foreign tourist nights spent (+3.3%) since domestic demand remained stable (0.0%). The nights spent in hotels and similar establishments grew by 5.4% while the demand recorded in other kinds collective of accommodation establishments receded by 6%.

France continues to enjoy a substantial surplus foreign trade balance for tourism. The surplus of the travel item of the Balance of Payments kept growing in 2000 at a rate of 14.3% compared to 11.4% in 1999. This performance is due to a 9.7% rise of travel receipts combined with a growth at a lesser rate of 6.5% of travel expenditures. Travel receipts accounted for 38.2% of the credits of the services item of the Balance of Payments in 2000.

Employment in hotels and restaurants sector rose by 4.1% in 2000, amounting to 793 000 jobs. Tourism sector accounted for 3.4% of total employment.

# Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)








The number of hotels and similar establishments decreased by 4.3% in 2000 breaking the positive trend of the three previous years. Bed-places followed a different pattern with a rise of 2.3% in 2000. However, this rate is less than the 15.6% increase recorded in 1999 or the 9.1% rise of 1998.

The total nights spent in collective accommodation establishments grew by 13.5% in 2000. With a positive growth rate of 19.7%, this result is mainly due to the rise of foreign tourist demand since resident overnight stays merely rose at a rate of 1.2%. Nights spent in hotels and similar establishments as well as the overnight stays in other types of collective establishments grew respectively by +11.4% and 21.4% in 2000.

The travel item in the Balance of Payments recorded a deficit in 2000. This deficit which amounted to EURO 34 million broke the trend of the surplus of the previous years. This result is due to a significant increase of 21.6% of the travel expenditures compared to a rise at a lesser rate of 15.8% of the travel receipts. However, these receipts accounted for 17% in the credits of the services item of the Balance of Payments.

Employment in hotels and restaurants sector grew by 4.9% in 2000 and involved 108,000 persons. The tourism sector represented 6.5% of total employment in 2000.







#### **Recent trends**

The number of hotels and similar establishments remained fairly stable in 2000 (-0.4%), but continuing the slow regression of the past years. This stability has lasted since 1997. The bed-places followed a different pattern with a positive growth rate of 1.5% in 2000 coming after a comparable rise (+1.4%) in 1999. Total nights spent in collective accommodation establishments grew significantly by 7.8% in 2000. This rate is more than the double of the 2.9% recorded in 1999 or the 2.5% rise of 1998. In hotels and similar establishments as well as other kinds of collective accommodation establishments nights spent grew respectively by 3.9% and 17.2%. Resident nights spent went up by 7.2%, a rate more than triple that recorded in 1999 (1.9%). Foreign tourist demand grew significantly by 8.6% compared to 4.5% in 1999.

The surplus of the travel item in the Balance of Payments jumped by 20.7% after being stable (-0.7%) in 1999. The 2000 result is due to a rise of 11.6% in the travel receipts that completely offset the 5.4% growth of tourism expenditures. In 2000 tourism receipts accounted for 48.3% in the credits of the services item of the Balance of Payments. Employment in hotels and restaurants sector amounted to 773,000 persons recording an increase of 4.2% in 2000 with respect of 1999. The tourism sector represented 3.7% of total employment in 2000.

## Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)









# Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)






## Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation - 2000



In 2000, there were 9 more hotels and similar establishments than in 1999 (+0.3%) offering a total of 3,317 more bed-places (+1.4%).

The total nights spent in collective accommodation establishments remained stable (-0.6%) in 2000 interrupting the positive trend of the previous years. In 2000, employment in hotels and restaurants sector amounted to 286,000 persons recording an increase of 13% with respect of 1999. The tourism sector accounted for 3.4% of the total employment in 1999.






The number of hotels and similar establishments grew by 3.2% in 2000 after a drop of 2.6% in 1999 compared to the previous year. Bed-places followed the same pattern with a growth rate of 9% in 2000 after a drop of 1.4% in 1999.

## Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)





In 1996 the number of bed-places grew by 42%.

Total nights spent in all collective accommodation establishments also reveal a positive trend. 1998 data show a growth rate of 9.6% in total nights spent. The growth rate, which in 1996 reached 137.1%, diminished to 40.3% in 1997. Both the nights spent by residents and non-residents follow the same trend while the latter presents a milder growth pattern.

# Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation ('000)









## Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation - 2000







2000 figures on the number of hotels and similar establishments reveal a growth rate of 6.1% indicating a continuation of the positive trend of the previous years. Bedplaces grew by 3% in 2000 coming after a drop of nearly the same rate in 1999 compared to 1998. Total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation grew impressively by 37.3% in 2000 after a drop of 11.1% in 1999 compared to 1998.

A rise of 38.7% of the activity of the hotels and similar establishments combined with an increase of 35.5% of the nights spent in the other kinds of collective accommodation establishments explained the remarkable growth rate of total nights in 2000. Resident nights went down by 7.5% while non-resident overnight stays grew by 48.8%, 55.2% of foreign tourist demand is attributed to EU15 residents, whose number of overnight stays rose by 54.9%. In 2000, data on arrivals of visitors indicate a rise of 27.5% confirming the positive trend of 1999 and 1998. 2000 growth rate is however more important than those of the previous years. The travel item in the balance of payments showed a considerable surplus in 2000, which represented an increase of 44.1% after a drop of 13.5% in 1999. The 2000 result is attributable to the sharp fall in travel expenditures that declined by 11.7% combined with a rise of 22.3% of travel receipts. In 2000, employment in hotels and restaurants sector in Croatia amounted to 73,771 persons, recording an increase of 10.5% with respect to 1999.




With twelve more units, the number of hotels and similar establishments kept growing in 2000 but at a lesser rate of 2.1% compared to 5% in 1999. The bed-places followed the same pattern with a positive growth rate of 1.7% in 2000 in retreat compared to 2.7% recorded in 1999.

In 2000, the total nights spent in collective accommodation establishments decreased by 3.7% breaking the positive trend of the two previous years. This result is mostly due to the drop of 8.4% of domestic tourism which was more accentuated in other kinds of collective accommodation establishment (-10.6%) compared to the drop recorded in hotels and similar establishments (-5.1%). Foreign tourist demand continued to grow in 2000 but at a lower rate of 6.3% compared to 7% in 1999. Overnight stays by EU15 residents grew by 9% and represented 34.6% of foreign tourist demand.

Figures on arrivals of visitors at the borders saw a drop of 6.5% in 2000. Arrivals fell by 6% in 1999 after a rise of 3.1% in 1998.

The surplus of the travel item in the Balance of Payments grew by 29.9% in 2000 indicating a continuation of the trend of the previous years. 2000 result is due to a rise of 8.3% of the travel receipts while tourism expenditures remained stable (+0.5%).



# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation - 2000




2000 data on the number of hotels and similar establishments indicate a 12.6% growth, breaking the declining trend of 1999 and 1998. Data on bed-places follow a similar pattern with a rise of 3.5% in 2000 after a decline of 3.7% in 1999.

Total nights spent in collective accommodation rose by 10.9% in 2000 after a drop of 3.7% in 1999. This result is attributable to a rise of nights spent both in hotels and similar establishments (+12.1%) and in the other kinds of collective accommodation establishments (+8.1%). Resident nights remained stable (-0.3%) while non-resident overnight stays rose significantly by 24.7%.

EU15 resident nights grew by 27.6% and accounted for 71.7% of foreign tourist demand. The number of arrival of visitors at the borders went up by 6% in 2000 breaking the slump in 1999. 34.3% of the visitors were tourists in 2000. The surplus of travel item in the balance of payments, which was declining the previous years, grew by 22.3% in 2000. With a rate of 15.7%, travel receipts followed the same pattern interrupting the declining trend of the previous years.

The travel expenditures kept rising in 2000 but at a lesser rate of 10.6%. In 2000, employment in hotels and restaurants sector in Slovenia amounted to 28,899 persons, recording an increase of 3% with respect to 1999.



# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in collective tourist accommodation - 2000




In 2000 the number of hotels and similar establishments increased by 2.6%, with 21 more establishments than in 1999. The corresponding capacity in terms of bed-places increased by 1%, with 700 additional bed-places.

In 2000 the total number of nights spent in hotels and similar establishments increased by 11.8% compared to the previous year, amounting to 3.8 million. Nights spent by non-residents increased by almost 20.8% and nights spent by EU guests increased by 15.5%. EU citizens represented 52% of nights spent by non-residents in 2000.

The total number of international visitor arrivals increased by nearly 16% in 2000 compared to 1999. Arrivals of EU visitors increased by 35%. Nationals residing abroad still make up the largest share of total arrivals (61%). The share of visitor arrivals of EU citizens, represented nearly 11% in 2000, compared to 9% in 1999. France, Italy and Germany are the main EU generating markets.

Foreign trade receipts in tourism represented 11% of total services receipts in 1999, but only 0.6% of current account receipts. In 2000 international travel receipts increased by 38%, while expenditures fell by 11%; and so the deficit of the travel account decreased by a third. Employment in hotels and catering in the public sector totalled 13,524 jobs in 2000, increasing by 12% compared to 1999.

# Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments (000's)



Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments - 2000




The number of nights spent by non-residents in hotels and similar establishments peaked in 1998, amounting to 14.4 million (10% compared to 1997).

In 2000 the number of arrivals of foreign tourists at the borders attained new heights, peaking at nearly 2.7 million, increasing by 10.3% compared to 1999. The number of tourists from the EU increased by 12.6% and accounted for nearly 80% of all tourist arrivals. The UK represents the largest influx of foreign tourists accounting for over 1.3 million arrivals (+ 17.9% compared to 1999).

Tourism represents an important sector of the economy. An indication of its contribution to employment are the 25,900 employees in the hotel and catering sector (+3.6% compared to 1999). Although Cyprus's overall foreign trade account is negative, it enjoys a surplus foreign trade balance for tourism.

Travel receipts represented 40% of total foreign trade earnings and 58% of total international receipts in services. In 2000 travel receipts increased by 27.5% compared to 1999, and the surplus by 29.6%.

#### Arrivals of tourists at the borders (000's)








In 2000 there were 96 more hotels and similar establishments (+ 10.5%) amounting to 39 938 more bed-places (+21.3%) than in 1999.

Egypt quickly recovered from the slump in inbound tourism of 1998. The number of nights spent by non-residents in hotels and similar establishments amounted to over 31 million in 1999 and nearly 33 million in 2000, increasing in 2000 by 5.8% over the previous year. Nights spent by EU residents increased by 10.5% in 2000.

These positive results were also largely reflected in the number of arrivals of foreign visitors, with arrivals in 1999 reaching the unprecedented figure of nearly 4.8 million, and then again peaking in 2000 at over 5.5 million. Total foreign visitor arrivals increased by nearly 15% in 2000 compared to the previous year and arrivals of EU citizens increased by 24%. In 2000 the share of EU visitors accounted for 54% of total arrivals, compared to 50% in 1999.

Tourism makes a substantial contribution to Egypt's economy. In terms of foreign trade, travel receipts in 2000 accounted for 19% of total foreign trade earnings and 37% of total receipts in services. Travel receipts increased by 29% in 2000, and the surplus by 34%.






### **Recent trends**

In 2000 there were 10 more tourist hotels (+ 3.0%) amounting to 8,459 more bed-places (+8.6%) than in 1999.

Total nights spent in tourist hotels in 2000 increased by 5%, amounting to over 19.5 million. Domestic demand represented just over 50% of total nights spent and rose by 2% in 2000 (nearly 9.9 million). Nights spent by non-residents in tourist hotels amounted to nearly 9.7 million rising by 7% compared to the previous year. The share of nights spent by residents from European countries accounted for 55.6% in 2000 compared to 56.5% in 1999. The trend in non-resident nights was confirmed by a 4.5% increase in the total number of tourist arrivals at the borders, peaking at over 2.4 million in 2000, compared to 2.3 million in 1999. The share of arrivals from European countries accounted for 57.5% of total tourist arrivals, of which a very large proportion is made up of arrivals from EU countries (80%).

Tourism plays an important role in the economy. Accommodation services and restaurants employed 101,700 persons in 2000 (+12.7% compared to 1999), of which 86% were employees. The revised data series indicate a positive tourism foreign trade balance. Travel receipts grew by 24.2% in 2000 compared to 1999 and the surplus increased by 18.5%. In 2000 international travel receipts represented 7% of foreign trade earnings and 27% of total services receipts.

# Total nights spent in Tourist hotels ('000)





# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in Tourist hotels<sup>(1)</sup> - 2000




In 2000 there were 30 more hotel and similar establishments than in 1999 (+7%), amounting to 2,668 bed-places (+8%).

Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments grew by 2.7% compared to 1999, to reach 3.8 million in 2000. This was driven by a 4.3% increase in nights spent by non-residents, whereas resident nights fell by 6.2%.

In 2000 the number of arrivals of international visitors dropped by 9% compared to 1999, mainly attributable to the 12% drop in visitors from the Middle East, who represented 73% of total visitor arrivals. Arrivals of European visitors accounted for 17% of the total, but represented 23% of all tourist arrivals. 

# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments - 2000




Nights spent in hotels have been rising substantially over the past years; indeed doubling since 1997. In 2000, the number of nights totalled 297 000, 26.1% more than in 1999. Tourists from Europe represent 36% of total nights spent by non-residents.

Arrivals of visitors from abroad have confirmed this positive trend. In 2000 arrivals increased by 10.2%, amounting to 742 thousand, compared to nearly 673 thousand in 1999. #### Total nights spent by non-residents in hotels ('000)





# Distribution of nights spent by non-residents in hotels - 2000






In 2000 there were 14 less hotels and similar establishments (-5.8%) amounting to 459 less bed-places (-1.1%) than in 1999.

The number of days spent by foreign tourists in hotels and similar establishments decreased by 14%, amounting to just over 7.9 million compared to nearly 9.2 million in 1999. # Total nights<sup>1)</sup> spent by non-residents in hotels and similar establishments ('000)





# EU share of total nights<sup>1)</sup> spent by non-residents in hotels and similar establishments - 2000




Tourist accommodation supply remained fairly stable in the year 2000, with 3 more hotels and similar establishments on offer than in 1999, amounting to 856 more bed-places.

In 2000 the total number of nights spent in hotels and similar establishments increased by 3.4%, amounting to the unprecedented figure of over 16.5 million. Nights spent by residents and non-residents increased at the same pace (3.6% and 3.0% respectively). Nights spent by EU tourists represented 81% of non-resident nights.






The rise in the number of accommodation establishments and bed-places has kept in pace with growth in the tourism sector in Palestine. In 2000 there were 15 more establishments and 1,298 bed-places than in 1999 (+ 16%).

The total number of nights spent in hotels and similar establishments during 2000 increased by 13.1% compared to 1999, indicating a much lower annual growth rate than those of the previous few years. Tourists from the United States and Canada formed 11% of total non-resident nights in 2000.

Tourism is considered to be an important sector for the economic development of Palestine. In terms of foreign trade international travel receipts account for a very large share of services receipts, representing 79.2% in 1999. In terms of current account receipts, travel receipts represented 14.5% in 1999. International travel receipts rose by 13.5% compared to 1998, and the travel surplus rose by 24.9%.

The hotel and catering sector employed 8,782 persons in 1999, increasing by 8.4% compared to 1998.

# Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments ('000)







#### **Recent trends**


In 1999 the number of hotels and similar establishments grew by 8% (+36) compared to the previous year, and bed-places rose by 6% (+1,884).

In 1999 total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments remained stable (+0.6%) compared to 1998, amounting to nearly 3 million. The 2% decrease in nights spent by residents was compensated for by a 2% increase in the number of non-resident nights. Guests from the EU represented nearly 27% of non-resident nights in 1999; Europe as a whole represented 37%.

Total arrivals at the borders of visitors increased by 8.8% in 1999 compared to 1998. The overriding majority of visitors come from Arab countries, accounting for 74% of total arrivals in 1999. EU visitors only represented 5%. The number of tourists (overnight visitors) represents 34% of total visitor arrivals. Tourist arrivals increased by 3% in 1999. EU tourists represented 15% of total tourist arrivals and compared to 1998 their number grew by 17%.

International travel receipts increased by 21% in 2000 compared to 1999. Expenditures of Syrians travelling abroad also rose at a similar pace. In 2000 international travel receipts accounted for 14% of Syria's total current account foreign trade earnings and 64% of international Services receipts. Employment in the hotel and catering sector amounted to 36,900 employees in 1999.

# Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments ('000)



# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments – 1999




#### Recent trends

In 2000 there were 14 more hotels and similar establishments (+ 1.9%) amounting to 5,498 more bed-places (+2.9%) than in 1999.

In 2000 the total number of nights spent in hotels and similar establishments remained stable (+0.3%) compared to the previous year. Nights spent by non-residents represent 94% of total nights. Total arrivals at the borders of foreign visitors reached new heights in 2000, amounting to over 5 million, compared to 4.8 million in 1999. In 2000 total arrivals increased by 4.6%. The share of foreign visitor arrivals of EU citizens represented 64% in 2000, increasing in number by 5.6% over the previous year. The main EU generating markets are Germany, France and Italy.

Tourism is an important sector of the Tunisian economy. As international arrivals have been increasing, so have Tunisia's tourism foreign trade receipts. In 2000 travel receipts grew by 7.2% compared to 1999, and the travel surplus by 5.5%. Whereas, Tunisia's overall foreign trade balance is negative, it enjoys a surplus in its travel account. Travel receipts accounted for 18% of total foreign trade earnings and 61% of total receipts in services in 1999. Direct employment in the tourism industry accounted for 73, 846 jobs in 1998.

# Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments ('000)



# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments – 2000



### **Recent trends**


In 2000 there were 48 less hotels and similar establishments (-2.7%) than in 1999, but capacity in terms of bed-places grew by 5.1%.

Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments in 2000 increased by 17.5%, after a drop of 29% in 1999. This momentary slump was due to the 45% decrease in non-resident nights. Resident nights, on the other hand, continued the gradual upward trend of the previous years, albeit at a lesser rate (1.4% in 2000, 5.3 % in 1999).

After the severe slump in 1999, international visitor arrivals attained new heights in 2000 with over 10.4 million. Arrivals of EU visitors represented 53% of total visitor arrivals. Tourists account for 92% of all visitor arrivals to Turkey. Tourist arrivals amounted to over 9.5 million.

Tourism plays an important part in the Turkish economy. An indication of its contribution to employment are the 169,455 employees in the Ministry of Tourism licensed establishments (accommodation, restaurants, travel agencies and yacht crews) in 1998. In terms of foreign trade earnings, travel receipts represent 10% of Turkey's current account receipts in 1999 and 32% of services receipts. Turkey enjoys a positive tourism foreign trade balance, which fell substantially in 1999 due to the drop in receipts.

# Total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments (000')





# Resident and non-resident shares of total nights spent in hotels and similar establishments - 2000



## **Technical Note**

For the EU and EFTA countries, the data used in this publication come from Eurostat's information system "TOUR" in New Cronos (Theme 4).

The data collection on tourism at European level is based on Council Directive 95/57/EC, adopted 23 November 1995. The Directive provides a basic set of variables on tourism supply and demand, for which European Union member states are collecting data on a regular basis.

For the Central European and Mediterranean countries, the data used in this publication are principally based on information provided by the National Statistical Offices and/or National Tourism Authorities. Monetary figures are presented in Euro calculated according to the respective average annual exchange rates. In some cases the conversion into Euro has been made using the US\$ exchange rate. Due to differences in data collection methods, definitions and other methodological approaches used by these countries, the data are not harmonised and thus not comparable. The geographical grouping of "Europe" refers generally to that used by the World Tourism Organisation.

The terminology specific to tourism used in this publication is fully in line with the definitions developed by Eurostat in the Community Methodology on Tourism Statistics.

Other Eurostat data sources used in the publication are Balance of Payments, Labour Force Surveys, Population, GDP(for European, Central European and EFTA countries: GDP at market prices, and for Mediterranean countries: GDP in volume), Euro Exchange Rate, Increase of Consumer Price Index (available in Eurostat's reference data base New Cronos). Population figures refer to 1 Jan 2000.

Currency: Millions of EURO (from 1.1.1999) - Millions of ECU (up to 31.12.1998)

<u>EU share of nights spent by non-residents:</u> Share of non-resident tourists originating from other EU countries in relation to the world total.

### Terms and definitions:

<u>TOURISM</u> is the activities of persons travelling to and staying in places <u>outside their usual environment</u> for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business and other purposes.

<u>Domestic tourism</u><sup>1</sup> comprises the activities of residents of a given area travelling only within that area, but outside their usual environment;

<u>Inbound tourism</u> as comprises the activities of non-residents travelling in a given area that is outside their usual environment;

<u>Outbound tourism</u> comprises the activities of residents of a given area travelling to and staying in places outside that area (and outside their usual environment).

The term "**Domestic**" in the tourism context differs from its use in the System of National Accounts. In the national accounts context it refers to activities and expenditures of both residents and non- residents travelling within the given area, which in tourism terms is domestic and inbound tourism.

<u>VISITORS</u>: persons travelling to a place other than that of his/her usual environment for less than twelve consecutive months and whose main purpose of travel is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited.

TOURISTS: overnight visitors

INTERNATIONAL TOURISTS: international visitors who stay at least one night in collective or private accommodation in the country visited.

TOURIST ACCOMMODATION is any facility that regularly or occasionally provides overnight accommodation for visitors.

<u>COLLECTIVE TOURIST ACCOMMODATION ESTABLISHMENTS</u>: Establishments which provide overnight lodging for the traveller in a room or some other unit. The number of places it provides must be greater than a specified minimum amount for groups of person exceeding a single family unit and all the places in the establishments must come under a common commercial-type management, even if it is non-profit making.

HOTELS AND SIMILAR ESTABLISHMENTS are collective accommodation establishments typified as being arranged in rooms, in numbers exceeding a specified minimum, and as providing certain services including room services and daily bed-making and cleaning of the sanitary facilities.

<u>HOTELS:</u> comprise hotels, apartment hotels, motels, roadside inns, beach hotels, residential clubs and similar establishments providing hotel services including more than daily bed-making and cleaning of the room and sanitary facilities.

<u>SIMILAR ESTABLISHMENTS:</u> comprise rooming and boarding houses, tourist residence and similar accommodation arranged in rooms and providing limited hotel services including daily bed-making and cleaning of the room and sanitary facilities. This group also includes guesthouses, Bed & Breakfast and farmhouse accommodation.

OTHER COLLECTIVE ESTABLISHMENTS: are any establishment, intended for tourists, which may be non-profit making, coming under a common management, providing minimum common services (not including daily bed-making) and not necessarily being arranged in rooms but perhaps in dwelling-type units, campsites or collective dormitories. These can be subdivided as follows:

<u>HOLIDAY DWELLINGS:</u> include collective facilities under common management, such as clusters of houses or bungalows arranged as dwelling-type accommodation and providing limited hotel services (not including daily bed-making and cleaning).

<u>TOURIST CAMPSITES:</u> consists of collective facilities in enclosed areas for tents, caravans, trailers and mobile homes. All come under common management and provide some tourist services (shop, information, and recreational activities).

<u>OTHER COLLECTIVE ESTABLISHMENTS N.E.C.:</u> comprise youth hostels, tourist dormitories, group accommodation, holiday homes for the elderly, holiday accommodation for employees and workers' hotels, halls of residence for students and school dormitories, and other similar facilities that come under common management, have a social interest and are often subsidised.

ESTABLISHMENTS: the local unit is an enterprise or part thereof situated in a geographically identified place. At or from this place economic activity is carried out for which - save for certain exceptions - one or more persons work (even if only part-time) for one and the same enterprise.

BED-PLACES: The number of bed-places in an establishment or dwelling is determined by the number of persons who can stay overnight in the beds set up in the establishment (dwelling), ignoring any extra beds that may be set up by customer request. The term bed-place applies to a single bed, double bed being counted as two bed-places. The unit serves to measure the capacity of any type of accommodation. A bed-place is also a place on a pitch or in a boat on a mooring to accommodate one person. One camping pitch should equal four bed-places if the actual number of bed-places is not known.

NIGHTS SPENT BY RESIDENTS AND NON-RESIDENTS: a night spent (or overnight stay) is each night that a guest actually spends (sleeps or stays) or is registered (his/her physical presence there being unnecessary) in a collective accommodation establishment or in private tourism accommodation.

<u>NET USE OF BEDPLACES:</u> the net occupancy rate of bed-places in one month is obtained by dividing total overnight stays by the product of the bed-places on offer and the number of days when the bed-places are actually available for use (net of seasonal closures and other temporary closures for decoration, by police order, etc.) for the same group of establishments, multiplying the quotient by 100 to express the result as a percentage.

Balance of Payments data are in line with the definitions in the Balance of Payments Manual by the International Monetary Fund. The "Balance of Payments" is defined as the record of a countries international transactions with the rest of the world (or, in other words, transactions of its residents with non-residents). Data in this publication mainly focus on transactions concerning "Travel" covers goods and services acquired from an economy by non-resident travellers during their stay on the territory of that economy and for their own use.
